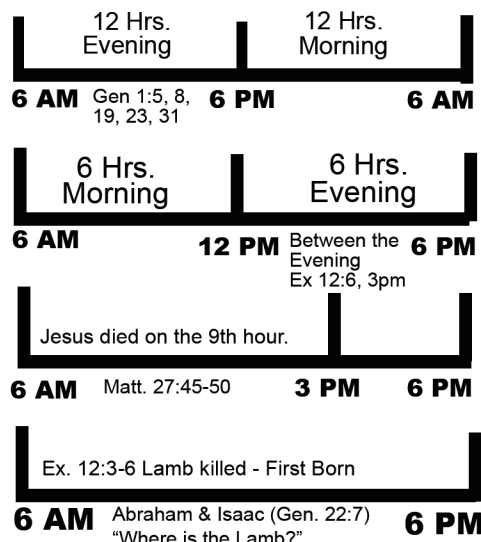
Lunar Calendar

4 New Years

1. New Year for Trees: Plant Trees
2. New Year for Kings: tied to counting the Reign of Kings & Anniversary of the founding of Jewish people after slavery
3. New Year of Cattle: Beginning of preparation for High Holy Days
4. Rosh Hashanna: Most Significant

The Biblical Day



Semicha Rabbi (Authority)

Stage 1. Memorize Leviticus. At age 6, tested.

Stage 2. Age 6-12: Taught Torah, first 5 books of the Old Testament by a Rabbi. Age 12: critical year. Had to memorize them & have a working knowledge of what they meant. Luke 2:45-50

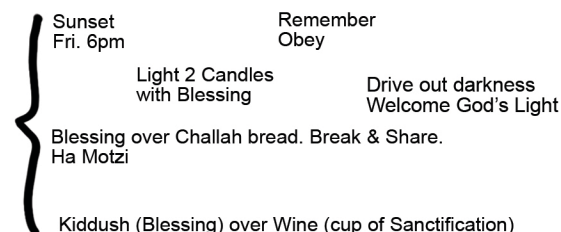
Stage 3. Ages 12-30 (Bible Silent) Attend Rabbinical School. At age 30 graduate Rabbinical school- Baptized (ordained) (2 witnesses of = station, John/Prophet, Holy Spirit.

- a) Choose disciples (live together/3 years) Have a yoke (teaching). (Matthew 11:28-30; 22:36-40).
- b) Send disciples out on their own. They memorized his teaching and followed it. (Acts 7:24-29; Luke 6:46-49).
- c) They lived with Jesus to follow his example (itinerant lifestyle)

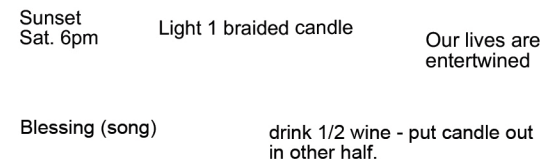
